

15 Days of Winter Break

Frozen Ice Globes

What You Need:

- balloons
- water
- food coloring (optional)
- scissors

Instructions:

1. Fill balloons with water and add a few drops of food coloring if you wish.
2. Tie off the ends of the balloons.
3. If temperatures are below zero at night, put the balloons outside overnight. Otherwise, balloons may be placed in the freezer until they are frozen.
4. Once the balloons are frozen, use scissors to cut the ends of the balloons. Try to do this outside as this could be messy.
5. Peel the balloons off the frozen globes.
6. Place frozen ice globes outside along walkways or wherever you wish!

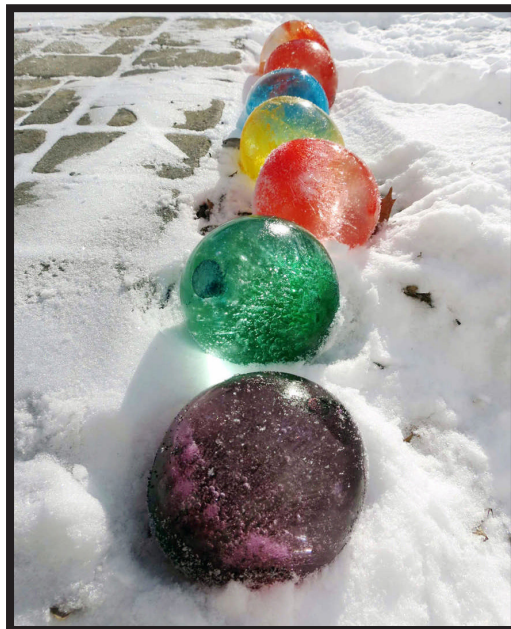
